Overtime session continued Wednesday when both chambers convened in Springfield. Amendments are still being filed and legislation continues to be introduced. The House is scheduled to return next Tuesday, July 21, and the Senate's return will be at the call of the Senate President. The House Personnel and Pensions Committee and Labor and Commerce Committee are scheduled to hold hearings on Governor Rauner's pension reform proposal and the 2014 Illinois Workers' Compensation Report respectively.

STATE BUDGET

The one-month appropriations bill, [SB 2040](#), has been sent to the Governor. On Wednesday, the Senate voted to concur on the bill that was previously approved by the House. The final vote was 39-0, with 15 members voting "present." The bill includes the House's latest amendment that ensures state workers are paid during July. The Governor is not expected to sign SB 2040.

The Senate also overrode the Governor's vetoes of five of the full-year budget bills passed by the Democrats at the end of May. The Governor vetoed all but a K-12 education budget bill. Despite the Senate's action, the House is unlikely to also override the Governor's vetoes. All 71 Democrats in the House would have to vote to override; however, not every Democrat originally voted for the budget bills. Speaker Madigan has reported that the House will take up additional appropriations bills.

PROPERTY TAX FREEZE

Also on Wednesday, the Senate Executive Committee adopted [Senate Amendment 2 to SB 316](#) (President Cullerton, D-Chicago), which would implement school funding changes and a two-year property tax freeze on all taxing districts (levy years 2016 and 2017 for home rule and non-home rule taxing districts outside of Cook County and levy years 2017 and 2018 for home rule and non-home rule taxing districts within Cook County). Once on the Senate Floor, though, the bill failed passage by four votes, 32-0-22.

HAPPY HOUR

Governor Rauner has signed [SB 398](#) into law as Public Act 99-0046. Among several provisions, the legislation overturns the ban on happy hour and permits bars and restaurants to offer drink specials for up to four "happy hours" per day for a total of 15 hours per week. The legislation does not allow volume specials and prohibits deals after 10 p.m. The law takes effect immediately.
